Cancer has been a part of Catherine Mize's life since she was a 21-year-old college student.

She quickly learned that the key to coping with cancer is to "keep putting one foot in front of the other, even when it gets really hard," she says.

Mize, then Catherine Reed, was diagnosed with Hodgkin's disease in 1978. She was treated with radiation, which at the time was not as targeted or safe as it is now. She had 12 weeks of daily radiation at St. Jude, which

involved her and her mother driving two hours both ways for treatment. She responded well, and while challenging, she was able to go back college that year. She continued receiving weekly chemotherapy infusions for a year in the college infirmary.

"My goal then and in my later diagnoses was to live as normal a life as possible," Mize says.

In 2008, she was diagnosed with breast cancer and had a double mastectomy and reconstruction. In 2013, she was diagnosed with endometrial cancer and had a hysterectomy. Both cancers were caught early and required surgery, but no further treatments.

"The reason those were caught early is because I am a big believer in staying on top of my screenings and listening to my body," Mize says.

"I was able to lead a fairly normal life because of my strong support group of family and friends," she says. "We laughed a lot because we figured if you don't laugh you'll cry. I am still surrounded by a wonderful support group."

Mize says cancer treatment over the years has taught her many things, including that some don't have the support they need.

"In the waiting room and in exam rooms, we are all equal," she says. "Cancer can affect anyone. But when



we leave and go back to our daily life – that's where things change. Some have strong support groups to help them get through. Some don't. That's why the Cancer Care Fund is vitally important. It helps fill in those gaps for people who need help. It helps with things that you may not even realize would be an issue until you are in the middle of it."

Mize is serving as the 2017 Take a Swing at Cancer Honorary Chair, and is carrying on a long family tradition of being involved with North Mississippi Medical Center's activities.

Her grandfather, R.W. Reed Sr., served as chair of the NMMC board from its beginnings. "My whole family – including my father, husband, brothers and sister have been involved in boards and as patients, so I can really see it from both sides, and understand the need for a strong regional hospital," Mize says. "I am looking forward to having a great time at this year's tournament and to helping make a difference for people in north Mississippi."
